In September SDNA held meetings to inform Southern Dakelh community members on Chilcotin Caribou Recovery Planning. These meetings gave community members an opportunity to learn and ask questions about caribou conservation and recovery scenario development involving habitat protection. Currently SDNA is involved in caribou monitoring and is working with the BC government to develop recovery scenarios that will help caribou populations to recover.
